Tree Removal Requirements:

All removals of live trees require County review and approval, and in most cases, shall only take place within an approved Activity Envelope.

Each tree with a six (6) inch or larger 'Diameter at Breast Height' (D.B.H.) removed within an Activity Envelope shall be replaced with one (1) or more trees having a total D.B.H. equal to at least the caliper(s) of the tree(s) removed. See §7-20-10 of the County Land Use Code for details.

Clearing or grubbing of land, or removal of vegetation and in some instances individual tree removal requires an earth moving permit and revegetation plan/tree mitigation plan and shall take place only within an approved Activity Envelope. Refer to the Earthmoving Informational Sheet or the Asset Management Plan for additional information.



What do I need to do before removing a tree or trees?

Contact a Planner with the following:

- ▲ Site Plan showing existing development and vegetation/trees to be removed.
- ▲ Parcel I.D. Number and previous land use approvals (if applicable).
- ▲ Reason for removal of tree or trees.
- ▲ Number, type and size of trees to be removed.
- ▲ Plan for tree replacement and/or revegetation of the site (when required).
- ▲ Photographs are always helpful!

The *selective* removal or trimming of *dead*, diseased or damaged trees or other woody vegetation that constitutes a significant and direct hazard to persons or property, is allowed pursuant to Sections 4-30-20 and 7-20-10 of the Land Use Code based on certain thresholds and criteria. Written confirmation from a Certified Arborist or recognized tree/forestry expert may be required.

Things to remember:

- ▲ Clear cutting or other large scale removal of trees/vegetation, particularly within avalanche path starting zones, shall be prohibited without special review.
- ▲ All wildfire mitigation must be approved by the Pitkin County Community Development Department prior to tree removal, even when recommended by a wildfire expert or State Forester.
- ▲ Special areas have special rules (ask your Planner):
 - Redstone Historic Preservation District.
 - Scenic View Planes.
 - Slopes greater than 15%.
 - Critical habitats including *wetlands/riparian* or *wildlife areas*.

Additional Info:

- ▲ You may be required to post financial security for replacement/revegetation if your project has a potential to impact watershed areas, has a potential for visual impacts, has a slope greater than 15%, disturbs critical vegetation and/or disturbs large areas.
- ▲ Revegetation and reforestation shall be completed during the first planting season after disruption and shall utilize native horticultural material. Replaced vegetation shall reach similar density and height to that removed within two (2) years following construction.
- ▲ Modification to approved Landscape Plans requires a formal amendment.
